- 3. Generate electric power. Generates 500 watts of portable power, 115 volts AC or DC. Has 12-V battery charger. \$190.
 - 4. Pump water. Lightweight 6

gal/min. pump uses standard garden hose for pumping out basements, pools or boats and sells for \$40. Heavy duty 80 gal/min. pump. \$160.

Trim hedges. Chrome blades andin. cutting length. \$100.

 Saw masonry or metal. Converts to a reciprocating saw that cuts through metal, concrete, plaster or wood. \$90.

7. Drill holes. Standard drill chuck adapts it for any bit up to ½ in. \$80.

PLASTIC FINGERS KEEP GRAIN FROM TRICKLING BACK OVER CUTTERBAR

Special Guards Stop Sickle 'Slobber' Loss

You probably don't know how much grain slips back over the cutterbar after it's cut in the field but best guesses say it's plenty. Cheney Weeder, of Spokane, Wash. has come up with a "Slobber Stopper" to catch that grain before it slobbers back to the ground.

Slobber Stoppers are plastic fingers that glue to the top of each cutterbar sickle guard. Inclined at an angle pointing into the combine, they catch plant stems that try to slip past. As the grain is held, fingers on the reel drop down and rake it into the feeder auger.

"You can't make a profit from your wheat unless you get it into your combine. Our Slobber Stoppers will make a profit for you each and every minute you run your combine," says Brant Kollar, manager of Cheney Weeder.

Slobber Stoppers sell for 85 cents each. A 24-ft. cutterbar costs about \$85 to outfit. To install, you simply grind down the rough surface of the guard and glue the plastic guards with Cheney's special 3M glue. Steel fingers, which you can weld into place, are also available.

New "Tire Saver" For Deere Planters

Ruin no more packer tires on your John Deere Max-Emerge planter. A specially-designed plate, called Save-A-Tire Spring Retainer, can be obtained at farm implement dealer stores to keep scrapers in place.

Costing only \$2.50, the small plate comes drilled and with the necessary bolts to install on Deere planters equipped with heavy-duty scrapers, says manufacturer Bob Messer, of Windom, Minn.

According to Messer, "The problem the Save-A-Tire solves is that when heavy-duty scrapers are used, the spring sometimes pops out of the scraper bracket, resulting in a loose scraper which then turns around and hits the packer tire located right behind the disk that the scraper is mounted on. The tire then gets cut up and must be replaced — at a cost of \$25 or more."

The Save-A-Tire fits any Deere Max-Emerge planter, but is needed only with heavy-duty scrapers which are used in heavy soil.
