Lane Smith designed and built a tilting trailer hitch to load a low hot rod on his trailer. The Sema award winning Tilt-A-Hitch is now sold in Austrailia. Since being discovered by FARM SHOW, the Tilt-A-Hitch has been seen on several TV shows. It has been on Fox Sports and on ESPN, and in dozens of magazines.

To tilt a trailer, lower the trailer jack to support the load, remove the blue pin, crank the jack up, and the trailer back tilts down for easy loading and unloading.

Smith initially built the Tilt-A-Hitch to haul his radical, 604 cubic inch, blown '32 coupe on a trailer behind his Kenworth motor home. Despite adding boards and blocks to extend the ramp, the angle was too steep to load the coupe. Tilt-A-Hitch solved the problem.

"I overbuilt the Tilt-A-Hitch to be bullet proof," Smith says. The Tilt-A-Hitch is made of 1/4 in. and 5/16 in. steel, and mounts to any 2-in. receiver. It has a powder coat finish, weighs 34 lbs. and is rated for 8,000-

Grain Bin Storage Shed

Jason Gogerty and his brother Jordan used a cutting torch to turn an unused 5,600-bu. grain bin into a storage shed. They keep their small tractor, garden equipment, tools and supplies in it.

They cut a large opening in the bin and used 6 by 6's to build a wooden frame that's screwed to some angle iron for reinforcement around the opening. The angle iron is embedded in cement at the bin's floor. They used 2 by 4's to frame two big 5 by 8-ft. plywood doors and mounted three big strap hinges on each door.

Jason's father Tim plans to use the grain bin shed in his hay rebaling business, in which he rebales round and big square bales into small square bales. He has been using a tractor inside a hoop shed to operate the baler and unroller. In the future he'll install a stationary engine, removed from a combine, inside the bin which will free up the tractor.

Michener developed the Grease Buster to solve the problem of fittings that would not take grease. Once solvent flows freely into the fitting, grease can then be injected with a grease gun to displace the solvent in the fitting.

The Shop size Grease Buster was introduced in the fall of 2001. It has a 7/16-in. diameter. Overall it's a stronger tool and it has about twice the capacity of the original tool.

The Grease Buster tool is available retail or wholesale, with quantity discounting available for bulk orders.

The Grease Buster tool comes with a one-year limited warranty. Using the tool without solvent or disassembly voids the warranty.
