### Mystery **Biscuits**

2 cups sifted flour 1 tbsp baking powder 1 tsp salt

1/4 cup mayonnaise 1 cup milk

3 tsp sugar

Sift flour, baking powder, and salt. Add remaining ingredients. Mix until smooth and drop by tablespoons on greased cookie sheet or fill a 12 muffin tin 2/3 full. Bake 18-20 minutes at 375°.

### Rhubarb **Butter** Crunch

3 cups rhubarb 1 cup sugar 3 tbsp flour

Topping: 1 cup brown sugar 1 cup raw rolled oats

1 1/2 cups flour

1/4 cup butter or shortening

Mix rhubarb, sugar, and flour well and place in a greased baking dish. Combine the topping ingredients and sprinkle it over the rhubarb mixture. Bake at 370° for 40 minutes. Serve warm with milk or cream.

### Wash Dav Casserole

3 lbs hamburger 9 slices bacon

3 onions 3 cups potatoes

3 cups celery

2 cans cream of

mushroom soup 3 cups cooked spaghetti 1 quart tomato juice 1 pound cheddar cheese

Brown hamburger and onions in a pan. Pour into casserole and add potatoes, celery and spaghetti. Pour mushroom soup over top. Fry bacon and lay on top. Pour tomato juice over top and add shredded cheese on top. Bake for 1 1/2 hours at 350°

### **Mint Patties**

1 box powdered sugar 2 tsp cream

1 tbsp butter

Melted semi-sweet

chocolate

1 egg unbeaten 1 tsp vanilla

3 drops peppermint oil

Mix together all ingredients except chocolate. Shape into patties and dip into melted chocolate. Let stand and serve.
