Best Light Bulbs Money Can Buy

New from Duro-Test are "the best light bulbs money can buy.

"They outlast conventional bulbs 3½ to 5 times, withstand vibrations and they won't break or burn out if water is splashed on them," notes Donald Haugen, distributor. "The bulbs are coated and will continue to burn even if you dipped a hot, lighted bulb into a pail of ice water."

In hog barns, for example, you can hose down the walls and ceiling with a high pressure washer without having to worry about spraying water on hot, lighted ceiling bulbs. Trouble lights equipped with Duro-test bulbs don't have to be handled with kid gloves, thanks to extra vibration and shock resistance built into the tough-built bulbs, Haugen points out.

Individual Duro-Test bulbs (110 V) are available in 50 watt (\$8.95 each), 60 (\$7.06), 75 (\$8.70), 150 (\$11.07), 200 (\$17.49), and 300 watt (\$18.52). A carton of six 100 watt bulbs sells for \$51.00.

MAKE CHEDDAR, MOZZARELLA, GOUDA, RICOTTA, COTTAGE AND MORE

New Do-It-Yourself Cheesemaking Kit

"It's like baking bread. The first time you do it it seems like a lot of work but after a couple times it becomes much easier," says Angelina Hoogmoed, Beausejour, Manitoba, who's developed cheesemaking kits and supplies that let even the novice make cheddar, ricotta, mozzarella, cottage and many other types of cheese right at home.

Cheese can be made from cow, goat or sheep milk. Key ingredients in all cheeses are cheese starter culture and rennet to coagulate the milk. Milk can come from the store or straight from the cow. Equipment needed includes a pan to warm the milk, a curd cutter, a thermometer, a fine woven cheesecloth, and a cheese mold in which the curd can be pressed.

Hoogmoed says cheese recipes are easy to follow. "It takes about 2½ hrs. from start to finish to make Dutch Gouda cheese. Pressing takes 3 to 5 hrs. Then you store the cheese for about 3 weeks to let it ripen," she

says. Complete recipes are available for each cheese, as are complete supplies for each type of cheese. A mozzarella kit, for examples, sells for \$8.95, while a blue cheese supply kit sells for \$19.95.
