Round Bale Super Tarps

"Our new sleeve tie down system makes our Super Tarps for round bales better than ever," says Bob Johnson, manufacturer.

Instead of individual grommets, the tarps now come with built-in sleeves into which you thread lengths of metal pipe. "This new system is much more effective in securing the tarps against wind, and it provides the fastest, easiest tie down system on the market. You can tie down the pipe-threaded sleeves with rope, or by hanging old tires, weighted with sand, onto the pipes."

Super Tarps are made of high tensile woven fabric for flexibilty and strength. They're guaranteed against ultra violet light and rotting and, according to Johnson, will last 5 to 10 years if secured properly. They're silver on the outside to reflect sun rays and black on the inside to prevent greenhousing

A 25 by 35 ft. tarp covers 54 5-by-4 bales (stacked in a 3-2-1 pyramid) and retails for \$269 (U.S.). A 20 by 36 tarp covers 54 4-

by-4 bales and sells for \$210. Other size tarps are available for covering 54 bales measuring 4.5-by-4 ft., 6-by-5, and 5.5-by-4 ft. Dealers-distributors wanted.

IT'S RUSTPROOF

New Farrowing Crate Made Out Of PVC Pipe

When his steel hog farrowing crates rusted out so bad that he could no longer repair them, Cecil Roth, Milford, Neb., started looking around for rust-free replacements. Coming up empty-handed, he decided to build his own "rust-proof" farrowing crates from PVC pipe.

"PVC pipe will never corrode and it's easy to clean," says Roth, who has 24 of the crates in use on his farm. "The plastic is slick, like waxed steel so manure can't stick to it. In the past it took me seven hours to pressure-wash 24 steel crates. Now it takes only 2 1/2 hours. The crates are also attractive and much quieter. They're easy on sows and people because there are no sharp corners to get hurt on. I've used mine for almost a year with no problems."

Crates are built from 3 and 2-in. dia. PVC

pipe and are lag bolted in place. The fittings and bottom supports are made from stainless steel. A stainless steel "wet-type" sow feeder is attached to the removeable front gate for easy cleaning. Both the front and rear gate are opened with one pin on each side. A 1/2-in. PVC water line delivers water both to the sow feeder and to a piglet nipple waterer built into one leg of the crate.

The crate, equipped with sow feeder, sells for \$285.

Roth also sells gates made from PVC pipe. A 7-ft. gate sells for \$70 and \$3.50 per additional foot.



PREVENTS PROBLEMS BY WIRING ALL ACCESSORIES TO A SEPARATE OUTLET

"Junction Box" Makes Tractor Wiring Easy

"Farmers are using more and more accessories with their equipment, such as sprayer monitors, seed monitors, yield monitors, CB radios, FM radios, telephones, and guidance system monitors. Wiring all of them to the same battery can cause problems," says Ralph Baillie, Tri-R Innovations, Gibson City, Ill., who's come up with a new electrical "junction box" that mounts on the side of the tractor for easy, no hassle electrical hookups.

Baillie explains that the number of electrical accessories being used on tractors and combines can cause electrical feedback that can erase software programs, etc. "Our junction box allows monitors, radios, and phones to be wired separate from your vehicle's battery. It hooks up to any 12-volt battery and is equipped with four lead hookups for electric wires and four fuses. LED lights let you know when the power fails due to a blown fuse or a dead battery. A switch lets you shut off power to all accessories whenever they're not being used. If

you have more than four accessories, simply install a second junction box."

New "Stop Stickers" Warn Kids Of Danger

A Wisconsin farm wife, worried about the many dangers facing her children on the family's farm, has come up with new "Stop Stickers" which show kids in graphic detail the dangers of each piece of equipment.

Teri Moldenhauer of Osseo came up with the 8 stickers, each of which illustrates a particular farm equipment danger. "Most warning stickers on equipment have either worn off or they have warning messages that kids can't read. These large 4 by 6-in. stickers let them know at a glance what the danger is," she says, noting that the stickers are made out of high quality material.

Her stickers simply say "Danger" on top and "Stop" at the bottom with an illustration between. She made rough sketches for the stickers and took them to her brother-inlaw, who runs a graphic arts business. He refined the designs and then printed the stickers in red, white and black.

"I can't believe the overwhelming response we've had to this idea," Moldenhauer told FARM SHOW. "I was raised as a city kid so my paranoia came from my unfamiliarity with all the large equipment. I

was surprised there wasn't something like this already available. If we can help prevent one accident, it will be worth it."

Moldenhauer sells the stickers individually or in sets for \$1 apiece or less, depending on quantity.
